On home cooling bills — clean your air conditioner so it doesn't use as much energy to run, and close doors to unused rooms to reduce the area you need to cool.



DID YOU KNOW ON AVERAGE,

Australian homes use 38% of their total energy consumption on heating and cooling? Follow the tips below to stay cool this summer whilst saving energy. The energy you save will also save you money...now that's hot!...and Cool!

- Fans use 85% less energy than an air conditioner – you could run six fans and use less energy than one air conditioner!
- Set your air conditioner thermostat to 24°C rather than an icy 18°C.
 Each degree lower can add 10% to overall consumption of the air conditioner unit.
- Ensure the outdoor section of your air conditioning unit isn't installed facing the sun, unless the area is constantly shaded, to allow adequate cooling of the unit.

- Ensure windows and doors are closed before turning your air conditioner on.
- Take advantage of the BBQ season and reduce oven use – ovens add heat to your home.
- Reduce hot water expenses and your core body temperature by having shorter, cooler showers.
- Use floor lamps with a compact fluoro globe instead of hot halogen downlights.
